10. 2018 Chair's report: Please provide a narrative of the 2018 has been an eventful year for ACS Malaysia past year's activity/successes/challenges: Chapter. The Chapter's committee has been élected under the leadership of Dr. Lee Hooi Ling. The Chapter has also re-shuffled the sub-committee members, and introduced three new Working Groups, namely Science Outreach, Education and Award to assist with the Chapter's administration. We have also invited and reached out to our distinguished members from the private university and industry to become a part of our National Advisory Board. Continuing our vision in transforming professional talents and fostering greater networking across chemistry boundaries in improving people's life, we conducted a list of activities in line with our strategic goals. (i) To provide contextualized information, we have members' get together at least twice in a year. We have assigned a webmaster for our official webpage to disseminate up-to-date information more effectively and we are also actively on Facebook and Twitter. Our members were also involved with the translation project of Festival Cards to Malay language. (ii) To advance member's professional career, we supported the 6th International Postgraduate Conference on Pharmaceutical Sciences (IPOPS) 2018 and Monash Science Symposium 2018. We also organised the Chemical Security Capacity Building Program with National Authority Chemical Weapons Convention (NACWC) and Malaysian Institute of Chemistry (IKM) and continuous Global Innovation Imperatives (Gii) Stakeholders Engagements. (iii) To improve education, we were involved with Science Outreach for Teaching Workshop with University of Otago involving teachers and teacher trainees in East Malaysia. In addition, we organised the South East Asia Global Innovation Challenge (SEA-GIC) with Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM). The theme was "Sustainable Energy, doesn't cost the earth". (iv) To communicate chemistry's value, we organised a series of chemistry festival events (K2J, STEM Playground, KLESF, K2M, PISF) across Malaysia and introduced SEED program in Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM). There was also a series of sharing sessions for students initiated by the ACS Student Chapter. To date, four universities in Malaysia have set up their respective ACS Student Chapter and two more to come in 2019. (v) To sustain financial resources, we introduced our Chapter's mascot in 2018, Octomist, a multitasking octopus. Efforts will be made to diversify income generations through our merchandise, various grants applications and collaborations as well as external sponsorships. Our Chapter was awarded the p3 award from ACS for our ACS Global Innovation Imperatives (Gii) Forum on Contaminants of Emerging Concern (CECs) initiative and we were one of the finalists for ChemLuminary. The Chapter is formed upon members' foundation and strength and we will continue to strive for greater heights in 2019 particularly in celebration of the International Year of Periodic Table with the grant that we successfully secured. 	In addition, we successfully secured the funding for ACS Project SEED Program in early 2018. This was the first Project SEED Program to be held outside the US. This year also marked the 50th Anniversary of ACS Project SEED Program since its inception in 1968, USA. This project was designed "for economically disadvantaged students to experience what it's like to be a chemist." and was carried out in Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM), Penang.
	Besides, we also secured the Festival Chemistry Grant 2018, being the third time awardee of the grant. This suggests that we have progressed so far in our chemistry outreach activities. In fact, from 2018 onwards, our objectives in the outreach program have been geared towards more impactful and meaningful activities. We conducted a series of chemistry festival events (K2J, STEM Playground, KLESF, K2M, PISF) across Malaysia last year.
	Another of our flagship program – the South East Asia Global Innovation Challenge (SEA-GIC) 2018 with Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM) was a major success. All together there were 38 teams from Malaysia and Indonesia submitted their applications involving 112 undergraduate students. 15 teams were selected for the final round competing under the theme "Sustainable Energy, doesn't cost the earth". Another focus for 2018-2019 was on Chemical Safety and Security aspect, besides the usual flagship programs. In 2018, we co-organised Chemical Security Capacity Building Program with Malaysian Institute of Chemistry (IKM) and National Authority of Chemical Weapon Convention Malaysia (NACWC). It was also a success as an awareness program with plans for more activities in this aspect in 2019. We have recently submitted an application for Chemical Security Program (CSP) grant. 	Although ACS Malaysia Chapter (established on 15th April 2014) is considered a relatively young registered society in Malaysia, we are growing strong thanks to the continuous support from ACS and our members. In line with our vision to transform professional talents and to foster greater networking across chemistry boundaries in improving people's life, we will continue our efforts to elevate the Chapter to even greater heights in 2019 and to make a difference with far-reaching effects.
