Malaysia also went into	

talents and improving people's lives, we managed to conduct activities in line with our strategic goals: (i) To provide contextualized information, we leveraged digital connection to disseminate information and engage with our members. We conducted our 6th Annual General Meeting (AGM) on 21 August 2021 via Zoom with a total of 43 attendees. Amid pandemic, the Chapter's webpage, WhatsApp group, Facebook and Twitter accounts are also very active and well updated. (ii) To advance member's professional career, we supported the IUPAC Global Women's Breakfast 2021 online talk on "How to be Resilient During a Pandemic", Monash Initiate 2021, IMU's Virtual Pharmaceutical Chemistry Week 2021, ACS-UTP Next-in-Chemistry Challenge 1.0 (NICC 1.0) and Yayasan Science to Action's initiatives -TAB-FOR-SAP project 2021/2022 (an environmental education and training of high school students from the B40 group) and Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Campaign 2021 event (by sponsoring COVID-19 PPE for schools as the new term re-opens). (iii) To improve education, we organised a series of virtual academic talks/webinars - Virtual talk on The Earth Day: Restore the Earth by Prof. Shane Snyder, What is the Environmental Footprint of Your Favourite Snack? by Dr. Jane Gew Lai Ti, ACS Malaysia Scientific Talk by Prof. Nguyen Thi Kim Thanh and Dr. Ruchi Gupta, ACS on Campus with Universiti Teknologi Mara (UiTM) and ACS Malaysia Industry and Career Talk by Dr. Amir Faizal Abdul-Manan. We also organised the Southeast Asia Global Innovation Challenge (SEA-GIC) with International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM). The theme was 'Waste Booming during the Pandemic: Resolving via Sustainable Chemistry'. In addition, our Student Chapters organised many webinars/virtual talks/sharing sessions/competitions. (iv) To communicate chemistry's value, we successfully organised ACS ChemFest 2021. This program was supported by the ACS Festival Grant. The event was conducted through online platform (Zoom) and live streaming in ACS Malaysia Chapter Facebook page with three different scientific experimental activities including Experiment 1: Water Surface Tension, Experiment 2: Acid and base pH and Experiment 3: Slime making. Total 240 students from various states in Malaysia were selected to receive the free Chemistry kit consisting of materials and PPEs that are required for the event. The participants and their accompanying parents felt very satisfied with the event, and feedback was very positive. In addition, our members also organised an online outreach event with the students of SMJK Katholik Petaling Jaya. More than 100 students participated, from the Science and Maths Club of the school. (v) To sustain financial resources, we introduced Brand/Marketing working group in the Chapter with continuous efforts being made to diversify income generations through our merchandise, various grants applications and collaborations as well as external sponsorships. Despite the challenges in times of Covid-19, with the support and determination from our members, the above-mentioned plans/activities were made possible. We hope everything will return to normal in 2022, albeit a new normal. We will continue to strive in propelling the Chapter to greater heights.

Reflecting on 2021, it has been a challenging year as we continue to battle the seemingly never ending COVID-19 pandemic. Many activities and events planned for the whole year had to be conducted online, even the ones originally planned for on-site. Nonetheless, various activities and achievements were still made possible with the strong supports of our members and partner organizations. 2021 can be said as our busiest year of the pandemic era. We have certainly progressed far in our chemistry outreach activities gearing towards more impactful and meaningful activities. Now we are one of the leading organizers for chemistry outreach events in Malaysia, becoming a household name. One of the highlights was the ACS ChemFest 2021, supported by the ACS Festival Grant. The event was conducted through online platform (Zoom) and live streaming via ACS Malaysia Chapter Facebook page with three different scientific experiments. Some experiments were designed according to the 2021 National Chemistry Week theme. A total of 240 students (from more 1000 applicants) from various states in Malaysia were selected to receive the free Chemistry kit consisting of materials and PPEs required for the event. Participants conducted the experiments online, together with the two facilitators from among the Chapter members and Student Chapter members. The event was made engaging through quizzes and lucky draws. From the survey, the participants and their accompanying parents felt very satisfied with the event, and the feedback was very positive. We even received overwhelming requests to organize this event again in 2022! The event was a major success with many participants from all parts of Malaysia, and was also featured in local newspapers. Another highlight for 2021 was our flagship program – the Southeast Asia Global Innovation Challenge (SEA-GIC), supported by the Global Innovation Grant. The event was successfully organized in collaboration with the International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM) and the newly-established IIUM Student Chapter. The theme chosen was 'Waste Booming during the Pandemic: Resolving via Sustainable Chemistry'. We received outstanding entries from all over South East Asia. This event served almost 200 participants inclusive of all the key events - pitching competition, digital art and webinar. We are also proud that in 2021, we further strengthened engagements with our Student Chapters. Many of our activities (e.g. series of virtual academic talks/webinars/sharing sessions/competitions) involved the Students Chapters participation and vice versa. We are glad that these efforts have been duly recognized through the 2021 ChemLuminary Award. Three of our Student Chapters also received the ACS 2021 Student Group Development and Engagement Grant. We will continue our efforts to elevate the Chapter to even greater heights in 2022, with far-reaching endeavours in line with our Chapter's vision and mission.
